I am pleased to present the annual report for the Health Products Stewardship Association (HPSA) for the year 2023. The year 2023 has been a pivotal one for the Health Products Stewardship Association (HPSA) as we continue our mission to consumer returns and responsible disposal of health products.

Since the programs' inception in 2011, HPSA has been dedicated to managing the Manitoba Medications Return Program (MMRP) for Pharmaceuticals (prescription drugs, non-prescription drugs, and natural health products) and the Manitoba Sharps Collection Program (MSCP) for Medical Sharps since 2021.

HPSA continues to operate in accordance with Manitoba Regulation 16/2010 of Household Hazardous Material and Prescribed Material Stewardship Regulation, both the MMRP and MSCP, ensuring strict adherence to Extended Producer Responsibility principles. This commitment underscores our dedication to regulatory compliance.

In 2023, HPSA expanded its reach and impact by collaborating with **428** pharmacies across Manitoba. Through these partnerships, we were able to collect **18,756** kilograms of pharmaceuticals and **26,818** kilograms of medical sharps, contributing to a cleaner and safer environment.

These programs are intricately crafted to guarantee the appropriate packaging, handling, transportation, and disposal of unused or expired Pharmaceuticals and used Medical Sharps received from the public in a secure, compliant, and environmentally conscious manner.

Looking ahead, HPSA remains committed to its mission of promoting the MMRP and MSCP programs and protecting public health and the environment. We will continue to collaborate with stakeholders, expand our programs, and implement innovative strategies to further our impact and achieve our goals. In addition to crafting our communication strategies and activities based on the 2023 survey outcomes, we also focused on educating the consumer on the proper safe disposal methods of unwanted medications and used medical sharps.

To summarize the foregoing points, the year 2023 has been marked by significant achievements and progress for the Health Products Stewardship Association. We extend our sincere gratitude to our members, partners, stakeholders, and the pharmacy community for their continued support and collaboration in the MMRP and MSCP programs. Together, we will continue to make a positive difference in the health and well-being of Manitobans and the environment.

# Definitions

The following terminology is used throughout the document.

<b>Collection Location</b>	Community pharmacies registered in the HPSA programs that collect unused and/or expired Pharmaceuticals and used Medical Sharps returned from the public.
<b>Pharmaceuticals</b>	Products sold directly to the consumer and include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Prescription drugs</li> <li>• Nonprescription drugs</li> <li>• Natural health products</li> </ul>
<b>Medical Sharps</b>	Needles, safety-engineered needles, lancets or other similar instruments that are designed to puncture the skin of individuals for medical purposes and that are sold to consumers.
<b>Steward</b>	Brand-owner/producer who is a member of the Health Products Stewardship Association (HPSA).
<b>Natural Health Products</b>	Under the <a href="#">Natural Health Products Regulations</a> , natural health products (NHPs) are defined as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Vitamins and minerals</li> <li>• Herbal remedies</li> <li>• Homeopathic medicines</li> <li>• Traditional medicines such as traditional Chinese medicines</li> <li>• Probiotics</li> <li>• Other products like amino acids and essential fatty acids</li> </ul> <p>NHPs must be safe to use as over-the-counter products and do not need a prescription to be sold.</p>
<b>Nonprescription Drugs</b>	Nonprescription drugs do not require a prescription of a practitioner under Section C.01.040.03 of the <a href="#">Food and Drugs Regulations</a> in order to be sold and are not listed in the <a href="#">Prescription Drug List</a> established under Section 29.1 of the <a href="#">Food and Drugs Act</a> . # I. HPSA Members

This report is submitted on behalf of the **126 industry stewards** of Pharmaceutical products and **43 industry steward** of Medical Sharp products that are members of the Health Products Stewardship Association. HPSA's mandate is to perform, on behalf of each steward, certain duties required under the Waste Reduction and Prevention Act and Household Hazardous Material and Prescribed Material Stewardship Regulations (Man Reg. 16/2010) through stewardship program plans filed with Manitoba Environment and Climate Change.

The industry stewards are responsible for 100% of the costs of the Manitoba Medications Return Program (MMRP) and the Manitoba Sharps Collection Program (MSCP). HPSA is accountable to its members for the collection and responsible disposal of unwanted Pharmaceuticals and used Medical Sharps returned from the public through its network of registered pharmacies.

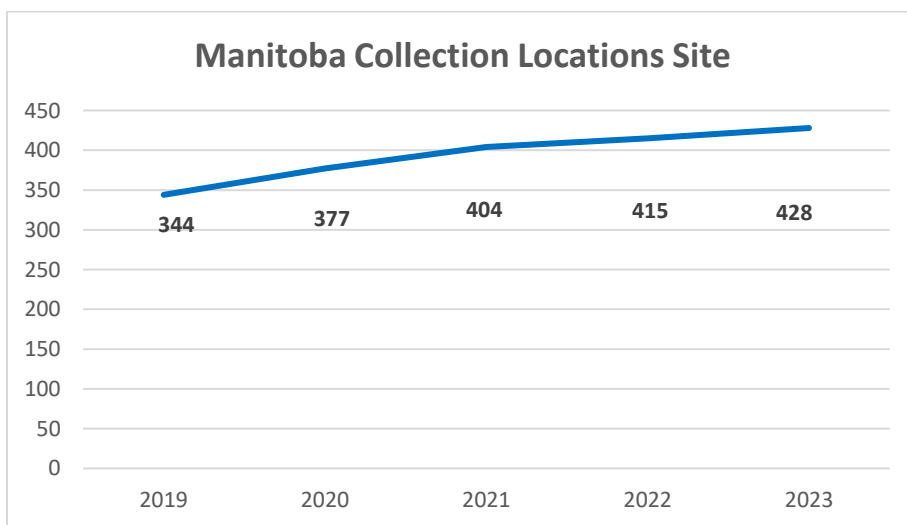


Table 3 – MMRP Performance 2019-2023

In 2023, a total of **18,756 kg** of Pharmaceuticals were collected in Manitoba.

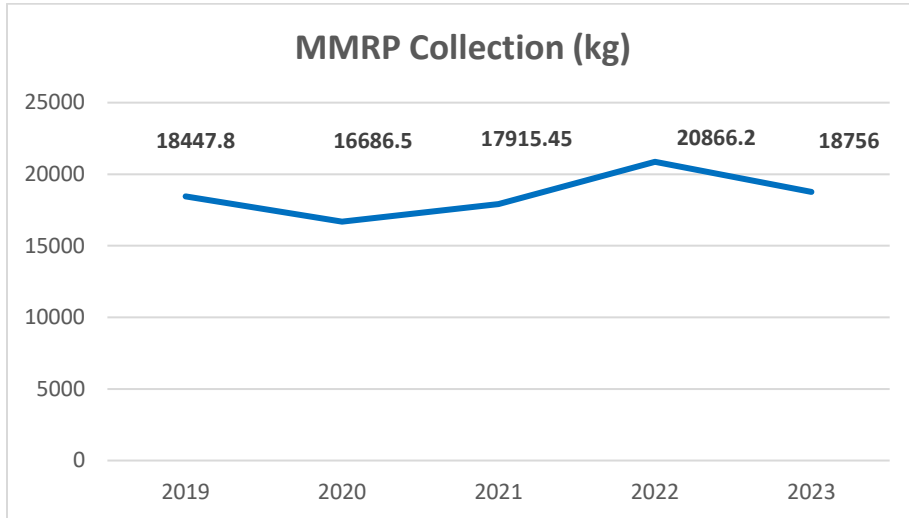
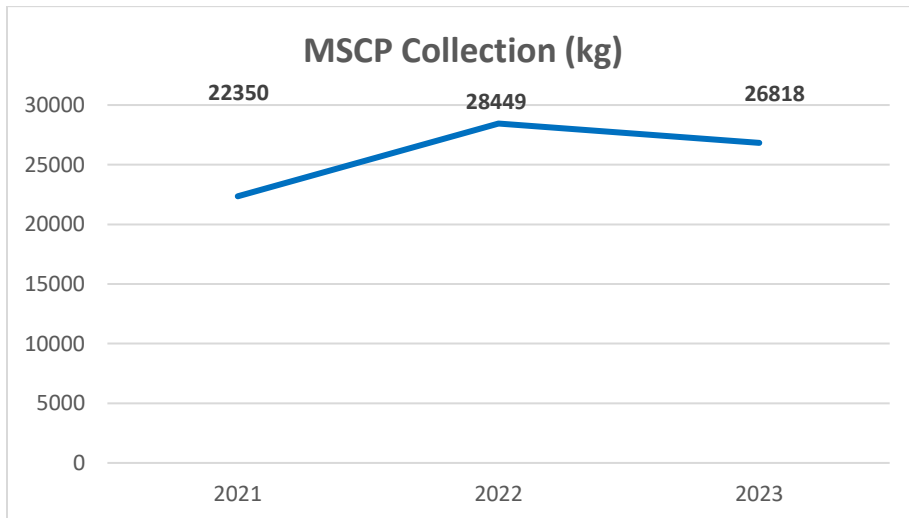


Table 4 – MSCP Performance 2021-2023

## IV. Public Education Materials and Campaigns

### A. HPSA Consumer Survey

During 2023, HPSA initiated its Bi-annual inquiry into consumer behavior, aiming to delve into the disposal methods adopted by Canadians for their surplus medications and used medical sharps. The study outcomes provided insightful revelations concerning consumer awareness, highlighting the subsequent findings:

- 58% of households with unwanted medications are informed about appropriate and safe disposal methods.
- 49% of households with unwanted medications know where to return them.
- 69% of those who self-inject at home know that medical sharps should be returned in a specifically designed sharp container.
- Pharmacies serve as the primary information source, with 53% of individuals aware of disposal options learning about them from pharmacists or drugstores.

Additionally, younger Canadians display lower awareness levels compared to older demographics; 81% of individuals aged 55 and above are familiar with safe disposal methods, while only 50% of those aged 35-54 and 33% of those aged 18-34 demonstrate similar awareness.

The next HPSA consumer survey is scheduled for March 2025 and key findings will be reported in the 2025 Annual Report.

### B. Provincial and National Campaigns

Throughout 2023, HPSA strategized and implemented a series of nationwide and regional initiatives aimed at amplifying program awareness and participation. This section delves into select pivotal campaigns from the year. Earned outreaches for all campaigns landed a total of **11 interviews**, resulting in 180 media placements across national English and French outlets and netting over **57 million impressions**.

Press release distribution for each campaign was also successful. Press releases were syndicated in a total of 468 outlets, generating over **177 million impressions** in English and French.

#### **National Drug Drop Off Month**

In recognition of National Drug Drop Off Month in August, HPSA partnered with Drug Free Kids (DFK) Canada to increase awareness among Canadian parents and other consumers about the proper disposal of unwanted medication.

HPSA commissioned an Angus-Reid Institute survey to provide insights around the issue and engaged an external strategic communications agency. The survey revealed a gap in understanding among HPSA's target audience, Canadian parents, when it came to the safest way to dispose of unwanted medications. These insights were localized to markets across Canada and shaped campaign messaging.

- 70% of Canadian parents admit to leaving their medications in a place that is accessible by their children.

- 87% of Canadian parents do not consider the safe disposal of unwanted medications as essential.

**Guided by survey insights, the campaign involved a three-pronged approach:**

1. [Media release distribution](#)
2. Earned media outreach
3. Social media amplification

### **Campaign Performance**

The volume of media attention generated by this campaign is an indicator of the sustained interest in the work of HPSA and DFK Canada in keeping Canadian households, communities, and our shared environment safe. Social media generated the following :

### **Diabetes Awareness Month**

During diabetes awareness month in November, HPSA ran a campaign destined to diabetic patients to raise awareness on the importance of safely disposal of Medical Sharps. The campaign consisted of press releases in both English and French along with a Social Media Campaign.

### **Conferences and Symposiums**

To extend the knowledge to the industry experts and inform educational institutions on the MMRP and MSCP programs, HPSA participated in the conference below.

#### **Panel Discussion - University of Toronto**

HPSA participated in a virtual panel discussion hosted in December 2022 by the University of Toronto. The focus of the conversation was “environmental sustainability at pharmacies” and the event was attended by PharmD students and educators.

## **C. Public Education Materials and Campaigns**

### **“How-to” Informational Assets for Pharmacists**

HPSA conducted a survey on pharmacists preferred educational assets. Based on the survey results, HPSA created the 3 most demanded assets: *How to dispose of medications and medical sharps posters*, *How to dispose of medications and medical sharps prescription bag stuffers and stickers*. In addition to these informational assets, all HPSA collection locations received various materials upon registration. These include:

#### **“How-to” Consumer Videos**

A pair of animated video guides have been produced to explain the simple steps consumers can take to safely dispose of their unwanted medications and used medical sharps. The videos are shared on HPSA’s YouTube channel and can also be found on the “Consumer” page of the HPSA website. The video instructions are also screened at many pharmacies. ### D. HPSA Website and Social Media Engagement

#### **Website**

Each quarter, more than **15,000** visitors come to the HPSA website. The top keywords visitors search include: *HPSA, sharps container, approved sharps container, and ‘can I return medication to pharmacy?’*

The HPSA website is home to a wealth of information, including details about how and where consumers can bring their unwanted pharmaceuticals and used medical sharps. [An easy-to-use interactive map](#) prompts visitors to enter their postal code and the map displays nearby drop-off collection locations.

#### **Social Media**

In 2023, HPSA’s social media strategy continued to focus on delivering consistent, high-quality content to various audiences. This social media engagement took advantage of dynamic formats, such as video and audio. HPSA also designed content pillars to spread awareness on the importance of the MMRP and MSCP.

#### **Social Channel Performance**

- 2,931 engagements across Instagram, the consumer-oriented platform
- Average of 90% increase in followers

#### **Notable Insights**

- HPSA content continued to exceed industry benchmarks, surpassing average engagement rates across all channels.
- Consistent content led to a significant increase in engagement on Facebook and LinkedIn. Meanwhile, highly visual content and carousel/video formats encouraged higher levels of engagement on Instagram.
- Targeted posts per province
- Posts promoting an upcoming panel or speaking engagement earned the highest level of engagement on LinkedIn.
- Content featuring HPSA executives yielded the highest engagement on Facebook.



### **Paid Social Media Campaigns**

In addition to organic (unpaid) social media content, HPSA paid to promote selected posts on Facebook, LinkedIn, and Instagram over the year. This included during campaign periods and top awareness moments, such as National Drug Drop Off Month and Earth Day.

Paid social media promotion is a powerful tool to expand HPSA audience and strategically target people based on their geography, demographic, or other qualifiers.

### **Paid campaigns included:**

- **World Water Day:** To commemorate World Water Day, HPSA published content related to the importance of keeping waterways clean. This includes providing consumers with the resources and information needed to dispose of unwanted medications and used medical sharps safely.
- **Region-Specific Data:** Leveraging data collected from Manitoba, and other provinces videos were shared on HPSA's social channels to highlight the impact of returned unwanted medications and used medical sharps on the environment and the continued importance on keeping their communities and waterways clean. The content, tailored to each province, was boosted on Instagram to create greater visibility and awareness of HPSA take-back programs
