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CEO's Letter

Dear Stakeholders,

I'm pleased to report 2024 was a year of significant achievement for the Health Products Stewardship Association (HPSA).

It was a year marked by substantial progress in fostering consumer engagement in take-back programs, strengthening collaboration with collection partners, and continuing efforts to educate consumers about the environmental impact of incorrect disposal of health products while promoting sustainable stewardship practices. Our take-back programs are carefully designed to ensure the safe, compliant, and environmentally responsible disposal of unused or expired medications and used medical sharps collected from consumers.

HPSA experienced significant growth in member recruitment in 2024, reaching a total of 167 members. This growth highlights the increased commitment of health products producers to fulfill their Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) obligations. Through our collective stewardship programs, HPSA helps its members meet these obligations by ensuring the safe disposal of products at the end of their life cycle, supporting a more sustainable and responsible approach to health product management.

We are committed to working with Manitoba Environment and Climate Change to ensure compliance and environmental stewardship in accordance with the Household Hazardous Material and Prescribed Material Stewardship Regulations (Man Reg. 16/2010).

On behalf of our members, HPSA administers the Manitoba Medications Return Program (MMRP) for pharmaceutical products (prescription drugs, non-prescription drugs, and natural health products) and the Manitoba Sharps Collection Program (MSCP) for used medical sharps that are sold for use in the "consumer/residential" waste stream.

In 2024, HPSA grew the collection network to **443** locations across Manitoba, representing a **93.86%** participation rate of all licensed pharmacies in the province. HPSA collected **19,124 kilograms** of unwanted medications and **28,256 kilograms** of used medical sharps. These achievements were possible due the collaborative efforts of our collection locations.

As the organization enters its 25th year of existence, HPSA remains devoted to continuous improvements in the delivery of the MMRP and the MSCP. As we continue to execute our strategy and work towards achieving our goals, we look forward to enhancing consumer participation, improving accessibility, and promoting safe disposal of health products.

This report is submitted on behalf of the **149 industry stewards** of Pharmaceutical products and **49 industry stewards** of Medical Sharp products that are members of the Health Products Stewardship Association (HPSA). HPSA's mandate is to perform, on behalf of each steward, certain duties required under the Waste Reduction and Prevention Act, and the Household Hazardous Material and Prescribed Material Stewardship Regulations (Man Reg. 16/2010) through stewardship program plans filed with Manitoba Environment and Climate Change.

The industry stewards are responsible for 100% of the costs of the Manitoba Medications Return Program (MMRP) and the Manitoba Sharps Collection Program (MSCP). HPSA is accountable to its members for the collection and responsible disposal of unwanted Pharmaceuticals and used Medical Sharps returned from the public through its network of registered pharmacies.

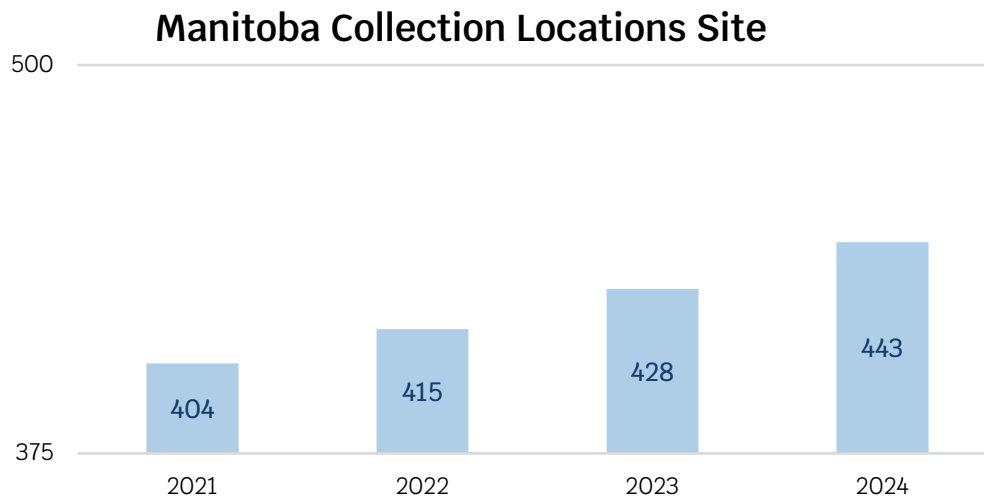


Table 3 – MMRP Performance 2021-2024

In 2024, a total of **19,124 kg** of Pharmaceuticals were collected in Manitoba.

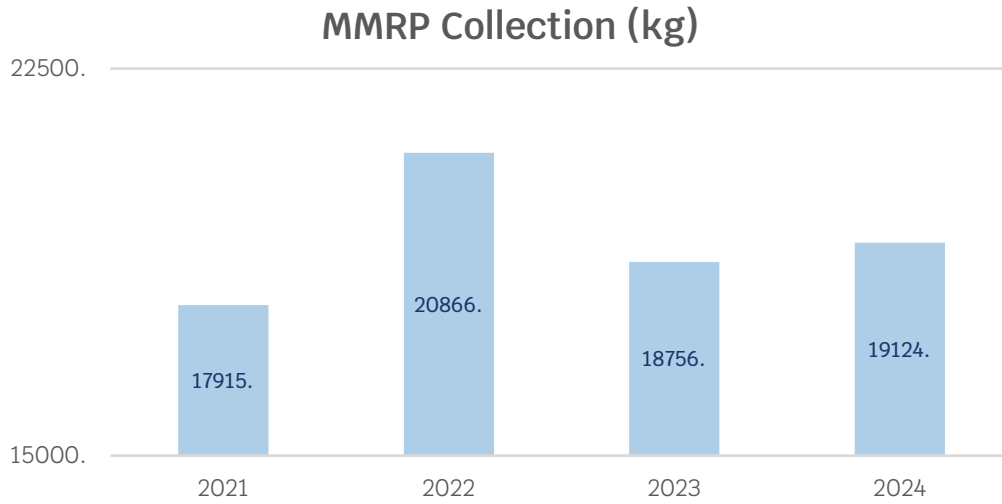
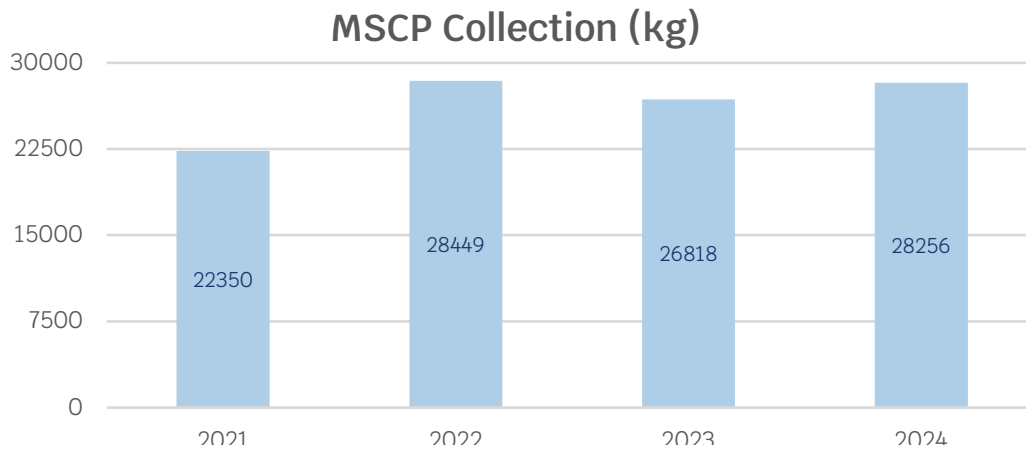


Table 4 – MSCP Performance 2021-2024

Section IV: Accessibility

The letter of approval for HPSA’s program plan stipulated that the program must:

Provide information on current accessibility gaps, develop accessibility standards by 2025 to support reasonable access to program collection services by Manitobans and begin reporting on accessibility.

To ensure that the Program provides "reasonable" consumer access to collection facilities, HPSA undertook a study of its accessibility in Manitoba. The GIS analysis of coverage for the Province of Manitoba was completed in August 2024 to support the assessment of consumer access to collection locations (retail pharmacies participating in the HPSA network). HPSA will conduct the next accessibility analysis in 2026.

At the time of the study, 36% of collection locations were classified as rural and 64% of collection locations were classified as urban. The distinction between urban and rural was established using the following criteria:

Section V: Public Education Materials and Campaign

1. Provincial and National Campaigns

In 2024, HPSA developed and executed a range of nationwide and regional initiatives to boost program awareness, education and engagement. This section highlights key campaigns from the year. Through earned outreach efforts, these campaigns secured 6 interviews and 2 press releases, in 18.5 million impressions.

Don't Dump Drugs

HPSA's "Don't Dump Drugs" campaign aims to raise awareness about the environmental dangers of improper medication and sharps disposal. The campaign focuses on simple, engaging messaging that resonates across generations and cultures, using the memorable slogan "Don't Dump Drugs" to drive the message home.

By personifying common disposal methods, like toilets and trash bins, we emphasize the harmful consequences these actions have on the environment. In addition, a new logo, inspired by the recycling symbol, was created to promote safe disposal practices and encourage the return of medications and medical sharps to pharmacies. This initiative seeks to change behaviours and foster greater public participation in protecting the environment through responsible disposal.

National Drug Drop Off Month

In recognition of National Drug Drop-Off Month in August, HPSA collaborated with Drug Free Kids (DFK) Canada to raise awareness among Canadian parents and consumers about the correct way to dispose of unused medication and safe storage in the household. A 2023 Leger survey, commissioned by HPSA, showed that 70% of Canadian parents admit to leaving their medications in a place that is accessible by their children and 87% of Canadian parents do not consider the safe disposal of unwanted medications as essential.

The campaign was divided into 4 components:

- 1) **Radio Campaign:** A joint Radio Campaign under the theme of “unfortunately, it happens too often” was aired for 13 weeks in 240 radio outlets across Canada, reaching a total broadcast of 23,000.
- 2) **Nation-wide Webinar:** Two webinars explored the impact of substance use on youth mental health, particularly during the back-to-school season while focusing on limiting access to drugs by returning unwanted medications. HPSA’s CEO had an intervention segment during the webinars to help parents prevent misuse in their household.

- 3) **Activation Event:** HPSA participated in take-back day, in collaboration with Rexall pharmacies to promote safe disposal and engage the communities in these programs. The attendees had the chance to learn more about the campaign, access educational materials, and learn about the role families and caregivers play in prevention efforts.
- 4) **Media News Highlights:** To promote this initiative, articles were published in 104 print and digital outlets. HPSA was interviewed on a CTV News report and, with our partner DFK, participated in a segment on The Evan Bray Show.

Diabetes Awareness Month

During diabetes awareness month in November, HPSA ran a campaign targeting diabetes patients to raise awareness on the importance of safe disposal of sharps. The Campaign consisted of press releases in both English and French along with a Social Media Campaign.

Ambassador Program

HPSA participated in the Ambassador Program in Winnipeg, along with other PROs, engaging in 16 events and 9 parades. During these activities, HPSA branded brochures and guidance on health products return practices were provided to the attendees. The program also featured radio advertisements and social media posts targeting Winnipeg and surrounding rural areas.

The purpose of this program was to raise awareness of proper medication and medical sharps disposal practices, ensuring the public is better informed about where these items should be returned.

Winter Road Program

Since 2019, HPSA has collaborated with other PROs in Manitoba to support recycling initiatives in remote First Nations communities, many of which can only be accessed via seasonal winter ice roads. This partnership reflects HPSA's dedication to enhancing program awareness and improving accessibility for all Manitobans.

2. Conferences and Symposiums

In 2024, HPSA actively engaged with industry experts and educational institutions to enhance awareness of the MMRP and MSCP programs. The organization participated in a range of conferences and symposiums aimed at informing the public, pharmacists and producers, with the goal of driving program awareness, member engagement and increasing participation at collection locations. These efforts were part of a broader strategy to elevate program visibility and foster stronger industry collaboration.

Speaking Segment – Canadian Health Food Association (CHFA)

At the 2024 CHFA conference, HPSA discussed the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) for health product producers. HPSA highlighted the importance of EPR programs in promoting sustainability and ensuring that producers take responsibility for the lifecycle of their products. By participating in the conference, HPSA helped raise awareness among producers about their evolving obligations under EPR regulations and encouraged industry-wide collaboration to create more sustainable practices in the health products sector.

Conference – Pharmacist Manitoba

HPSA participated in the Pharmacist Manitoba conference, setting up an engaging booth. Through interactive presentations, informative brochures, and discussions with industry experts, HPSA continued to educate healthcare providers, pharmacists, and the public about safe disposal of unwanted medications.

3. Social Media and Website

In 2024, HPSA achieved significant growth and engagement through our social media channels, amplifying our reach and impact within the health products sector. Through a combination of organic content and targeted paid digital ads, we effectively expanded our audience base and increased awareness of key initiatives.

Insights:

- The paid ads allowed us to broaden our visibility and connect with new stakeholders with more than **300,000 impressions**.
- **The campaign generated more than 6,000** visits to the website.
- This balanced approach helped strengthen our online presence, resulting in increased interactions and a deeper connection with our audience.

HPSA's website underwent a comprehensive revamp, resulting in a more streamlined and user-friendly layout. The site now features distinct sections and detailed guidelines for each province, for Consumers and Collection Locations separately, offering updated information on the proper procedures for returning medical sharps and medications. New resources were also added.

4. Educational Materials:

HPSA enhanced its educational assets to ensure users can easily access vital resources and information. The updated guides now offer a more streamlined and informative layout, featuring direct links to educational videos, collection location maps, and other materials available on the HPSA website. These resources are designed to provide clear, step-by-step guidance on the safe disposal of medications and medical sharps, as well as other critical topics. The updates aim to improve

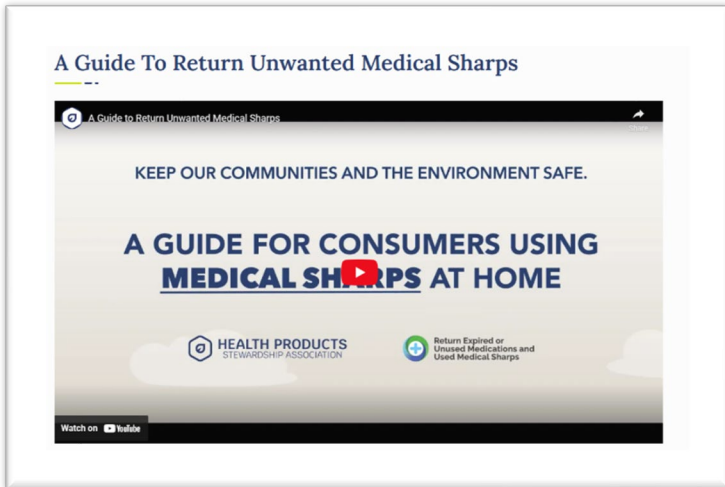

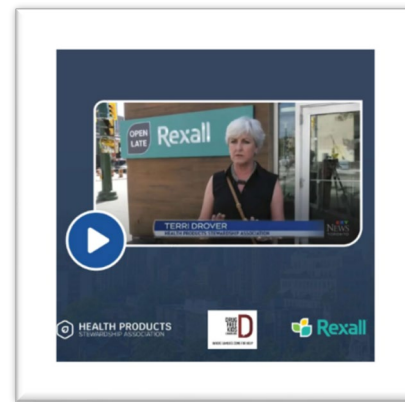
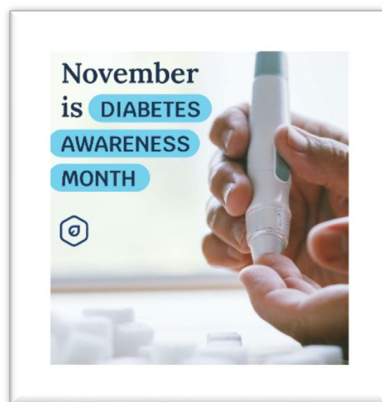
